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Make a Difference Day Project

Suitcases for youth- Did you know that many children coming into foster care often have to place their treasured possessions into TRASH BAGS because social services can not provide a suitcase for every child? Imagine what it feels like to put all your things closest to you into a trash bag while leaving the only home you have ever known. Well, it has happened to plenty of us, and we can tell you, IT DOES NOT FEEL GOOD! SaySo, Inc., plans to change this by sponsoring a "Suitcase Collection Project" for Make a Difference Day. We are asking all members, local chapters, and partnering organizations to support this project by helping us collect donated new suitcases or duffel bags. We want every foster youth in NC to be treated with dignity during their moves (which are so hard to begin with). SaySo Plans to Visit the Captial!

Nine SaySo members will work with state policy makers from June 28-July 2, 2004!! The page programs include: Senate, House and Governor programs. These Page Programs affords NC youth the opportunity to see first-hand how laws are made by participating in the legislative process.
