If so, you need to know about ETV

The North Carolina Education and Training Voucher (ETV) Program offers grants to foster youth and former foster youth to attend **colleges, universities, and vocational training institutions**. Students may receive up to \$5000 a year for four years as they pursue higher education. The funds may be used for tuition, books or qualified living expenses related to post-secondary education.

- The student must have aged out of the foster care at age 18 or been adopted from foster care with adoption finalization after their 16th birthday.
- They must be under the age of 21 to enter the program.
- They must be enrolled in or have been accepted into an accredited college or vocational training program.
