Good News!

-Here is this month's good news:
New LAW! Foster youths MUST
Get Credit Reports!

A new law has just passed that required every youth in foster care age 16 and older must have a credit report every year while in foster care!

This is a great law because foster youths are at high risk of identity theft! This law went into effect September 30, 2011. In addition to getting an annual credit report, your social worker needs to help you understand what the report says and help you resolve any inconsistencies in the report. Be sure to talk to your social worker about it and get your report cleared up early.
